Function Appointee to the EAC Board of Directors

Communicates with the EAC Librarian in a timely fashion providing any additions and changes to the Sampler Registry on the media

Submits written semi-annual reports to the Board

Submits an annual proposed budget to the Board

Communicates with the Editor of *Embroidery Canada* presenting

pertinent Sampler Registry information for publication

Communicates with the EAC Webmaster presenting pertinent

Sampler Registry information for inclusion on the EAC website

Reviews regularly and determines the cost of copies of the Sampler
