

# Seminar Grant Guidelines

## **Purpose**

The Seminar Grant has been developed to support and encourage the aim of the Association to preserve traditional techniques and promote new challenges in the Art of Embroidery by covering a four-day or two two-day class registration fee to an Embroiderers' Association of Canada, Inc./Association canadienne de broderie, Inc. (EAC/ACB) member at an EAC/ACB Seminar.

One Grant is available to be awarded annually.

## **Eligibility**

- The applicant must be an EAC/ACB member in good standing who has been a
  member of the Association for two (2) years immediately preceding the application
  date, with the exception of current Officers or Directors of the EAC/ACB Board,
  contractors, any member of the Grant Committee, professional fibre artists and
  professional teachers of needlework.
- The recipient may not receive the grant more than once in ten (10) years.
- The grant is not transferable.
- The grant may only be applied to class(es) at the next EAC/ACB Seminar.

## **Application Guidelines**

- The Grant application must be submitted by email or mail to the EAC/ACB Vice
   President by the seminar registration date in November. Application forms are
   available on the website (eac-acb.ca) or from the EAC/ACB Vice President or Chapter
   Presidents.
- All fully completed application forms will be reviewed by the EAC/ACB Seminar Grant Selection Committee and a recipient determined. The decision of the Selection Committee is final.
- Only one grant application per person per year will be accepted.
- The successful applicant will be notified before November 21. All other candidates will be notified shortly after that.

- Payment will be made by EAC/ACB to the Seminar Committee on behalf of the successful applicant upon notification of registration in the Seminar class/es.
- The successful applicant is responsible for paying all other fees (i.e. kit costs, one-day classes, tours, etc.) and all other seminar-related costs.

#### **Requirements and Conditions**

- The successful candidate is responsible for registering for the seminar by November 30. The deposit is the responsibility of the applicant.
- The successful candidate will be required to complete the project (if a technique class) or samples (if a process class) and write a short article of approximately 450-500 words discussing the benefits derived from the funded class/es.
- Photos of the completed project/samples and the article are to be submitted to the EAC/ACB Vice President by April 1 of the year following the seminar for which the grant was given.
- EAC/ACB reserves the right to submit the above to the Editor of *Embroidery Canada* or the website and/or display it at the seminar the following year.
- If the successful candidate is unable to attend all or part of the funded class/es, they shall inform the EAC/ACB Vice President immediately. The candidate is then responsible for reimbursing EAC/ACB any grant monies not refunded to EAC/ACB by the Seminar Committee.
- If the project/samples/article are not completed by the April 1 deadline, the grant must be returned in full by May 15 of the year following the seminar, and the candidate will be ineligible to apply again.
