Our Aim:

To preserve traditional techniques and promote new challenges in the art of embroidery through education and networking.

## Types of Membership

### Chapter Membership

Individuals may join EAC through a local chapter. Cost is \$40 annually for EAC membership plus local membership fees for chapter privileges.

### National Membership

Individuals not affiliated with a local chapter may join EAC as national members.

- \$40 CAD annually for Canadian addresses
- \$50 CAD annually for US addresses
- \$60 CAD annually for the rest of the world

### Affiliated Membership

Institutions and groups belonging to other national or international organizations may become affiliated with EAC. Affiliates will receive one copy of *Embroidery Canada* magazine—four issues yearly.

- \$50 CAD annually for Canadian addresses
- \$60 CAD annually for US addresses
- \$70 CAD annually for the rest of the world

### Youth Membership

Open to youths ages from 9 to 21 years as a youth chapter member or as a national member.

- Youth members within Canada pay a \$15 EAC fee.
- Chapter members pay the EAC fee plus any chapter fees.
- National members are not affiliated with a youth chapter pay their fees directly to the EAC Youth Appointee.
- All youth embroiderers receive the quarterly newsletter *Youth Embroiderers' News*.
