BOUNTIFUL HARVEST BOOKMARK



DESIGNED BY PAM KELLOGG

STITCH COUNT: 24W X 100H OR ABOUT 2" X 8"

Materials needed:

- Kreinik Very Fine #4 Braid 221 Antique Gold
- Kreinik Silk Mori: 2013, 2015, 2063, 2066, 4033, 4034, 6086, 6106, 6107
- · 24-count stitchband in white (Zweigart brand)
- #24 Tapestry needle
- scissors

Instructions:

Each square on the chart equals two fabric threads, so stitch this design over two threads centered on your stitchband fabric. Use two strands of Silk Mori or one strand of Braid according to the color key. Use One strand of Braid or Mori for backstitching.



Satin stitch leaves with Mori 4034

Color Key:

- \star Very Fine #4 Braid 221 Antique Gold
- Silk Mori 2015 Medium Dark Gold
- Silk Mori 2013 Light Gold
- Silk Mori 2063 Light Pumpkin
- 🔳 Silk Mori 2066 Dark Pumpkin
- Silk Mori 4033 Light Kelly Green
- 🔳 Silk Mori 4034 Medium kelly Green
- Silk Mori 6086 Dark Grape
- Silk Mori 6106 Dark Lavender
- Silk Mori 6107 Very Dark Lavender
- Backstitch with #4 Braid 221
- Backstitch curly q's and stems near pumpkin with Mori 4034

Don't have any Silk Mori? Use embroidery floss in your choice of colours.

And you don't have a stitchband? Use linen or Aida of your choice and Fraycheck the edges or fringe or hem the edges.

TRY A NEW STITCH...CHEVRON STITCH

Bring the thread up at 1 starting at the bottom on the left side and go down at 2. Bring the needle up at 3 (halfway between 1 and 2) and make sure you don't catch Stitch 1-2 in your needle. Go down at 4 at the top to the right of 3 and come up at 5. Go down at 6 and up at 7 (halfway between 5 and 6) making sure you don't catch Stitch 5-6 in your needle.

Continue working alternately between the bottom and top.

This stitch can be worked on linen, Aida or fabric suitable for surface stitching. If using fabric for surface stitching, lightly mark top and bottom lines on the fabric as a guide.

CROSS STITCHER'S SURPRISE SERIES

JULY - LIBERTY BELL



If you don't want to use the Rainbow Gallery fibres, stitch these with regular embroidery floss or #8 perle coton. The colours are given so you have an idea what colours to use.

You can also use beads, metallic threads or choose whatever colours

Stitch Count: 44h x 44w—approximately 3" H x 3" W 28 ct Antique Gold Country French linen from Wichelt (#86-270) stitched over two or 14 ct Antique Gold Country French Soft Touch Aida (#367-270).



Rainbow Gallery Fibers - 1 card each

FT15 Soft Sheen Fyre Werks® Old Gold - 1 strand

- M826 Mandarin Floss Pearl Gray 2 ply
- ✗ P19 Pebbly Perle[®] Black 1 ply
- RT35 Rainbow Tweed Dark Brown 1 ply

- RT41 Rainbow Tweed Gray 1 ply
- S822 Splendor[®] Dark Red 2 ply
- S1076 Splendor[®] Dk Blue Violet 2 ply

After completing all cross stitches, back stitch with 1 strand Old Gold Fyre Werks[®] around the edge of the main design area as indicated by the solid line on the chart. Use 1 ply black Pebbly Perle[®] and back stitch the crack in the bell. We attached the star charm to the blue background square just to left of the bottom edge of the bell, using dark red Splendor[®] (the ring portion of the charm actually falls into the red square just above). (charm #13124BR from By Jupiter!)

Stitch Count: 44H x 44W—approximately 3" H x 3" W 28 ct. Antique Gold Country French linen from Wichelt (#86-270) stitched over two or 14 ct Antique Gold Country French Soft Touch Aida (#367-270).



Rainbow Gallery Fibers - 1 card each

- E901 Elegance[™] Pale Golden Brown 1 strand
 FT21 Fyre Werks[®] Soft Sheen Lt Copper 1 strand
- S849 Splendor[®] Dark Olive 2 ply
 - S1036 Splendor[®] Plum 2 ply

✓ RT35 Rainbow Tweed Dark Brown – 1 ply

After completing all cross stitches, back stitch with 1 strand Lite Copper Fyre Werks[®] around the edge of the main design area as indicated by the solid line on the chart. We attached three brass bee charms in the background area of the design using the Dark Olive and Plum Splendor[®] colors – see the large 'X's on the chart for placement. (3 charms #80007BR from By Jupiter!)

Stitch Count—44 H x 44 W—approximately 3" H x 3" W 28 ct Cappuccino Country French linen from Wichelt (#86-265) stitched over two or 14 ct Cappuccino Country French Soft Touch Aida (#367-265).



Rainbow Gallery Fibers - 1 card each

- x E899 Elegance™ Dark Ecru 1 strand
- H630 Hi-Lights Antique Gold 1 strand
- M810 Mandarin Floss Cranberry 2 ply
- P47 Pebbly Perle® Dark Chocolate 1 ply

- / RT69 Rainbow Tweed Slate Blue 1 ply
- S906 Splendor[®] Med. Pistachio 2 ply
- S958 Splendor[®] Pistachio − 2 ply

After completing all cross stitches, back stitch with 1 strand Ecru Elegance[™] around the edge of the main design area as indicated by the solid line on the chart. Make a long stitch with 2 ply of Dark Chocolate Pebbly Perle[®] for the flag pole. We attached the "A+" charm in the top left square of the background with Pistachio Splendor[®]. (charm #15042BR from By Jupiter!)
