2 strands of floss were used for all full stitches. Backstitch lettering with 2 strands of 3799 (thick solid line). Backstitch detail on vest with 1 strand of B5200 (dashed line). Backstitch snow lady with 1 strand of 310 (thin solid line).

TRY A NEW STITCH...CORAL KNOTS

Bring the thread up on the right side of your design line (A). Lay it along the line of the design and hold it down with your left thumb. Take a small stitch under and perpendicular to the design line (B and C) and pull through. Make sure to bring the needle over the lower thread as in the diagram.

Continue making the Coral Knots along the design line ensuring that they are an equal distance apart. They should look like little beads on your thread.

CROSS STITCHER'S SURPRISE SERIES

OCTOBER-WITCH HAT



NOTE: Stitch the purple Fyre Werks with half cross stitches to avoid a stich that is too heavy or tight. Make large Smryna crosses over 4 threads with CRo7 Crystal Braid. After completing all cross stitches, back stitch with 1 strand Black Elegance around the edge of the main design area as indicated by the solid line on the chart. If you wish, attach a cat charm at the large 'X' with some Terra Cotta Splendor. (charm #25001AG from By Jupiter!).

If you don't want to use the Rainbow Gallery fibres, stitch these with regular embroidery floss or #8 perle coton. The colours are given so you have an idea what colours to use.

You can also use beads, metallic threads or choose whatever colours you want. Make these little pieces your own!

NOVEMBER—HARVEST PUMPKIN

Stitch count: 44h x 44w - approx. 3"h x 3"w

28ct Cappuccino Country French linen from Wichelt (#86-265) stitched over two. or 14ct Cappuccino Country French Soft Touch Aida (#367-265)

Rainbow Gallery Fibers - 1 card each

- ✓ M815 Mandarin Floss Rust 2 ply
- * ND15 Nordic Gold™ Bronze 1 strand
- P76 Pebbly Perle[®] Dark Olive 1 ply
- RT26 Rainbow Tweed Sea Green 1 ply
- S1038 Splendor[®] Med Camel 2 ply
- S1050 Splendor[®] Dark Brass 2 ply

After completing all cross stitches, back stitch with 1 ply Dark Olive Pebbly Perle around the edge of the main design area as indicatged by the solid line on the chart. If you wish, you can attach a cornucopia charm in the upper left corner with some Dark Brass Splendor. (Charm #60017AG from By Jupiter!)

DECEMBER-STOCKING STUFFER

Stitch count: 44h x 44w – approx. 3"h x 3"w 28ct Wheaten Country French linen from Wichelt (#86-267) stitched over two or 14ct Wheaten Country French Soft Touch Aida (#367-267)

Rainbow Gallery Fibers - 1 card each

- E800 Elegance[™] Cool White 1 strand
- E820 Elegance[™] Ruby Red 1 strand
- H625 Hi-Lights White Pearl 1 strand
- I ND2 Nordic Gold[®] Gold 1 strand
- S1063 Splendor[®] Fern Green 2 ply
- S1064 Splendor[®] Dk Fern Green 2 ply

After completing all cross stitches, back stitch with 1 strand Nordic Gold around the edgeof the main design area as indicated by the solid line on the chart. If you wish, attach a gold stocking charm in the lower right corner with Fern Green Splendor (note that the ring of the charm where you actually attach it will fall into the block just above). (Charm #88052 from By Jupiter!)

KARATE ZIPPER PULL

Materials Used:

7 count Plastic Canvas Mesh Needloft Yarn: #37 Silver - 7 1/2 yds. #41 White - 1/2 yd. #57 Yellow - 1 yd. #27 Holly - 1/2 yd. #48 Dark Royal - 1/2 yd. #48 Dark Royal - 1/2 yd. #46 Purple - 1 yd. #01 Red - 1 yd. #15 Brown - 1 yd. #00 Black - 5 yds. To Finish Project: #310 DMC Thread - 5 yds. Keychain Hook & Ring

Stitches Used:

Continental Stitch Reverse Continental Stitch Straight Stitch Embroidery Backstitch Whipstitch



Instructions:

Cut 2 pieces of 17X48 threads (16X47 holes) according to the pattern. Using the pattern only stitch one of the pieces you cut. Uncoded sections are done in Silver Continental Stitch. First belt rank is done in White (we used pink on the pattern so you could see it better). Using black DMC thread stitch the word Karate as shown on the pattern. Using black DMC thread stitch a line onto the center of the second yellow, purple, red and brown belts as seen in the finished project. Using black DMC thread backstitch each belt rank and completely around the black belt as seen in the finished project. Stitch the second piece you cut out entirely in black. You can stitch someone's name on it afterwards with any color DMC thread to give it a personal touch. Whipstitch both front and back pieces together. Fish the Keychain hook through the top about center and then add the ring if you wish.

This project is definitely versatile.....as you can change the belt rank depending on the Karate discipline you take. We used the belt ranking that my son went through to get his Black Belt in Muay Thai (white, yellow, gold, green, blue, purple, purple one, red, red one, brown, brown one, black belt recommended and black belt). If your discipline calls for fewer belt ranks, just shorten your project (but it would be best to do this at the top) by a few rows. Also if you want to, you do not have to stitch a second piece and use this as a bookmark (just add a piece of black ribbon or tassel at the top).
