Course Outline

Review the *Admission Information* sheet which lists the requirements of the application process.

The four parts of this course are divided as follows:

Part 1: Required Reading - includes

- two book reviews
- development of an outline of the history of embroidery and the start of your annotated bibliography

Suggested time: 4 months

Part 2: Course Design -

- with an emphasis on your focus of embroidery
- general teaching considerations

Suggested time: 10 months

Part 3: Writing and Research - includes

- researching an embroidery collection –
 e.g.; museum, church or private collection
- essay
- annotated bibliography

Suggested time: 8 months

Part 4: Examination – practical and written

Suggested time: 2 months

The timelines noted above indicate that the Instructor Certification Program can be completed within 24 months.

The maximum time allowed for the course is 36 months
