Judging Criteria

Original Design

Award

Each entry will be adjudicated on its own merit. Certificates will be awarded to all entries with a minimum score of 70%.

The judges will use the following guidelines when examining your entry. Having an awareness of the elements and the specific criteria can assist you in your own self-evaluation of your embroidery piece.

Impact 5%

Overall, do the elements and principles of design work together to produce an exciting piece, something that has a wow factor?

- Elements: line, shape, form colour, texture, space, value
- Principles: pattern, contrast, emphasis, balance, proportion, harmony, rhythm

Design (20%)

- Is there a focal point?
- Is there a balance between positive and negative space?
- Does the design bring a fresh approach?
- Is there an appropriate use of proportion?
- Are the motifs placed in a way that looks balanced?
- Does it seem like the elements are arranged in a definite plan?
- Is there good use of variety that adds interest to the piece without being overwhelming?
- Is there an arrangement of parts that produces an overall harmonious design or effect (unity)?

Colour (20%)

- Does the stitcher understand the basic rules of colour theory and apply them in a pleasing way?
- Do the colours enhance each other?

- If achromatic or monochrome, does this enhance the work?

Technique (15%)

- Are the surface stitches executed in a skillful manner?
- Where appropriate, is counting accurate?
- Where appropriate, is cutting close and accurate?
- Are curves and circles smoothly stitched?
- Have all design lines been covered?
- Are the techniques used in harmony with the fabric and design?
- Has the exhibitor used inventiveness in the use of stitches?
- Has the exhibitor chosen challenging stitches?
- Have threads been started and ended appropriately with no visible carry-overs on the back?
- Are threads the right length to prevent overwearing?

Suitability of materials (15%)

- Are the threads and stitches suitable for one another and for the design?
- Is the ground fabric the right count, weave, weight, etc. for the chosen design?
- Are the materials of high quality?
- Are the thread dyes consistent?

Supporting Materials (15%)

- Does the documentation effectively summarize the design process?
- Has the entrant supplied all the documents required for this category?
- Has the entrant written an artist statement that conveys the inspiration and thought processes for design development?

Finishing and Mounting (10%)

- Is the piece in pristine condition?
- Has the piece been properly pressed?
- Is the fabric grain correctly aligned?
- Is there puckering due to lack of blocking or poor lacing?
- Where visible, are the corners consistently formed?
- Does the framing detract from the piece? (Piece may or may not be framed)
