Discover the joy of stumpwork with *Sweet Pea*, a charming project that blossoms with detail. From the flower in full bloom to the playful bee buzzing close, every stitch adds depth and realism.

You will explore practical techniques, including padding, wired elements, thread painting, and more.

The result is a design that feels fresh from the garden. This project is perfect for stitchers who want to grow their skills while creating something truly delightful.

Project Details

Techniques: Stumpwork and beading

Stitches: Long and short stitch, Turkey work, needle-woven picot, buttonhole stitch, straight stitch, lazy daisy stitch, fly stitch, overcast stitch, couching, and beading

Kit Includes: Ivory silk main fabric, quilter's muslin, cotton for detached elements, organza, thread card with stranded cottons, metallic thread, needle pack, bead pack, Turkey work comb, wire, and felt

Student Supplies: Two 15cm (6") hoops, 10cm (4") and 20cm (8") hoop, awl, fine tweezers, straight pins, fine embroidery scissors, mechanical pencil or Frixion pen, 30cm x 30cm (12" x 12") square of lightweight cotton fabric of any colour (will be discarded after completion)
