
## LEARN A NEW STITCH... OVERCAST STITCH OR TRAILING

This stitch is like a fine cord and is great for embroidering delicate stems or outlines.

Bring the laid threads (orange colour) up at A. With a separate needle, bring up the working thread (blue colour) up at A.

Hold the laid threads down on the design line with your left thumb and work small, close satin stitches over the laid threads.


When you get to the end of the design line, take the laid threads to the back. Then take your working thread to the back and secure the laid thread in place with your working thread.


## ANGEL ORNAMENT





### MATERIALS: (for one-sided ornament)

5<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 4" piece—#7 Mesh Plastic Canvas #16 Tapestry Needle Plastic Canvas Metallic Yarn by Rainbow Gallery 3 yds—PC1 Gold 3 yds—PC10 White Pearl 3 yds—PC15 Purple 2 yds—PC15 Purple 2 yds—PC13 Fuchsia 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> yds—PC14 Lite Blue Worsted Weight Yarn 1<sup>/</sup><sub>2</sub> yd—Lite Peach 1<sup>/</sup><sub>2</sub> yd—Lite Peach 1<sup>/</sup><sub>2</sub> yd—Dark Brown (or desired hair color) 1—Small Brass Heart Charm



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- Cut one piece of canvas (21 holes x 34 holes) and trim according to dark outer lines of pattern.
- 2. Work the star halo in Continental, overcasting the outer edges at the same time. Work the face, collar and bodice of dress, hands and fuchsia stripes on skirt in Continental. The purple stripes are worked in Slanting Gobelin. Overcast the side edges of the skirt in purple at the same time. Work the hem in gold Continental, overcasting those edges with gold as well. The hair, sleeves and wings are all worked in long slanted stitches noting the direction of the stitches. Overcast the wing edges with white pearl at the same time.
- 3. Using sewing thread tack the heart charm in place between the hands.
- 4. Cut an 8" length of white pearl yarn, form into a loop, and sew or glue to the top back side of the angel for a hanger.


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## LITTLE WITCH



Each square equals 2 threads.

- P19 (3 ply) × C F31 S923 (4 ply) 0 W83 (2 strands) ☆ F43 ٥ F9B S815 (4 ply) Δ F531 S
- P19 (2 ply)
- 1. Cross Stitch following Master Chart and color legend.
- Hat Brim—long stitches (at every thread) with 1 strand F531. Dress Border—Elongated Cross Stitches (2 x 4) with 1 strand F531. Eyes— French or Colonial Knots in 2 ply P19. Hair may be brushed gently with nap brush, taking care not to catch other fibers.
- Backstitch as follows: Lettering—2 ply P19; Mouth & Spider thread, legs—2 ply P19; Bag Handle—1 strand F9B.
- 4. Loop a small bundle (3" long, 10-12 threads thick) of BG4. Lay it near end of broom handle and anchor with 1 ply P19. Cover with 3 (over 4) stitches as shown on chart.
- Attach spider with 1 ply P19 in center of backstitched legs. Add pumpkin button, at dot, with matching thread.

## HAPPY BROOM BROOM

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


## HOME SWEET PUMPKIN

Complete all cross stitches. The horizontal rails of the fence are stitched with an "oblong cross stitch" making the stitches twice as high as they are wide -- that is, two squares high and 1 square wide. Back stitch the bird house hanger with Rust Grandeur<sup>®</sup> and all of the leaf vines with 2 ply Autumn Rainbow Tweed. Attach the golden pumpkin button in the cluster of leaves at lower right at the III symbol, and a black bird on the bird house and another perched on the fence - or wherever you like it best.

This design is easily made more "spooky" for Halloween! Just stitch it on navy or dark purple fabric, add a jack-o-lantern face to the bird house and use buttons that are more of a Halloween theme!






